Dear Parents/Carers,

Many thanks to all parents/carers who responded to our recent 'Parent Survey'. We appreciate all your comments and suggestions and are delighted to see that 100% of parents feel that their children are happy in school and are making good progress.

We have included the analysis of the survey in this news letter for your information and I will be discussing the contents with staff and governors.

In response to areas we could improve on:

- the school currently is unable to offer nursery provision due to having no classroom or toilet facilities for this age group.
- Curriculum information is provided on the school website in the form of Curriculum Maps — copies of the curriculum maps for each year group will be sent out to parents.
- More trips and experiences the school tries very hard to ensure that all children are offered quality trips and opportunities in 2016-17 we spent over £8500 on school trips and enrichment opportunities. All trips, for the last 6 years, have been fully funded by the school except for Y5/6 residential trips which have been either free or heavily subsidised. The school will continue to make every effort to provide quality trips and opportunities for all pupils.
- School meals: The school works closely with Taylor Shaw Catering to ensure that all children have a wide selection of choices. Any issues regarding school meals will be passed onto Taylor Shaw to be addressed.
- Wrap around care: The school is currently unable to provide wrap around care - this is due to staffing and cost, however, we will look into provision requirements and costs for parents.
- After school clubs: The school endeavours to provide quality after school club provision, however, due to the small number of staff and rooms available this is limited. There are currently no charges for after school clubs and this limits opportunities to employ additional coaches.
- More facilities on the playground £2000 was spent in Spring 2017 on playground equipment as requested by Playground Leaders.
- More Sport activities 2016/17 £9,777.76 was spent on Sports and children were involved in football, tag rugby, gymnastics, dance, judo, hula hooping, basketball and cross country. This would be considered good in any setting.

Once again many thanks for your feedback - we will look closely at what we can do to improve further.

The School Uniform is as follows:

Winter (September – Easter):

Extreme Haircuts


The school does not permit children to have 'extreme' haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children.
