#### Emotional Well-being for all!

2018-19 Academic Year has started well with three new members of staff joining our school team:

Mr Laws who is teaching Year 5 children

Mrs Julie Carr who has been appointed as an Emotional Well-being and Resilience Co-ordinator.

Mrs Sanderson – Teaching Assistant supporting Class 3.

All new staff have settled into the school well and are making valuable contributions to our school family.

#### **Emotional Well-being:**

Our Lady Star of the Sea Primary endeavours to support all pupils, staff and parents with regards to emotional well-being. We work hard to be as supportive as possible to children and their families and we are happy to provide advice and support to ensure that children are happy to come to school and feel safe and secure.

The school employs:

- A School Counsellor, Carol Gash, who provides counselling sessions on a Wednesday morning. Children who access these sessions are normally referred to the service following consultation between staff and parents.
- An Emotional Well-being and Resilience Co-ordinator, Julie Carr, who provides opportunities for children to talk about their feelings and discuss ways in which to be more resilient.
- A Parent Support Advisor (PSA), Michelle Massey who is employed by the school to engage with parents who request support.

In addition to this, staff at OLSotS are always prepared to listen to and support children in school. We feel that the school does provide a caring environment where children's needs are well supported.

This year we will also address the emotional well-being of staff and have already identified a member of staff who will act as an Emotional Well-being Designated Support.

In order for everyone to be content and reach their potential it is important that the needs of all stakeholders; staff, children and parents, are met. Everyone associated with the school should feel supported and respected.

The school acknowledges that there are times when parents and children may not be happy with something that has happened in school, however, in order to solve concerns or problems it is important that approaches to school are made in a respectful manner. This will ensure that no one in the school feels threatened in any way.

#### Important E-Safety Information


It has come to our attention that there is a channel entitled "Jeffy" on YouTube, which we believe some of our children may be watching.

The videos are puppets with adult voices directed towards children that not only include explicit language but sexual related content as well. It is extremely inappropriate for any children at primary school age. At this time, the channel is not protected by any rating and therefore not flagged up as inappropriate when children log onto it.

I would advise parents speak to their children about this channel and monitor what the children are watching.

At school the Smooth wall filtering system will not allow the content to be downloaded so we would appreciate your cooperation in monitoring the usage at home.
